

MOBILITY INFORMATION FOR OUR CHURCHES

St Joseph's Church, Te Puna

- There are no mobility parks.
- St Joseph's is an old church and is not well-suited to people with mobility issues. There is a ramp into the church, but – unfortunately - two steps still have to be negotiated once you are in the church.
- There is a toilet with ramp access behind the cottage – there is also a toilet with ramp access in the Parish Centre building
- There is no hearing loop available
- Large print newsletters are available – see one of the greeters for assistance
- If you need to have Holy Communion brought to your seat, please make your needs known to the priest before Mass begins

St Therese Chapel, Bethlehem

- There is one mobility park, near the front path leading into the chapel
- There is full mobility access into the chapel
- A mobility toilet is located at the rear of the chapel
- There is no hearing loop installed
- Large print newsletters are available – see one of the greeters for assistance
- If you need to have Holy Communion brought to your seat, please make your needs known to the priest before Mass begins

St Mary Immaculate Church, Tauranga

- There are several mobility parks in the carpark nearest to Elizabeth St. To access these, drive up the drive, past the front door of the church, and the mobility parks are straight in front of you.
- To access the upper areas of the church (Blessed Sacrament Chapel, supper room, toilets) there are two external ramps – one on the Elizabeth St end of the church, one on the Cameron Rd side of the church (quite steep.) These doors are generally locked for security purposes and will need to be unlocked before entering. Please ask our greeters for assistance with this.
- The mobility toilet is sited between the male and female toilets, in the upper area of the church
- A hearing loop is available – to access this, sit on the front right side of the church (near the band area)
